INSTITUTIONAL STRUCTURE

- ▶ The Federal Ministry of Environment, in its capacity as the Government Ministry responsible for Climate Change secures Executive Order for the development of the National Adaptation Strategy and Plan of Action (NASPA).
- ▶ The Head of the Ministry appoints a Group/Forum to facilitate and oversee the development of the NASPA (NAPA Steering Committee)
- ▶ The NASPA Management/Coordination Unit
- ▶ The NASPA Technical Team (The NAPA Team) composed of the Sectoral Working Groups
- ▶ All relevant stakeholders
- ▶ Consultative and inclusive approach

Assessments

- ▶ **The Technical Team and its Working Groups:**
 - assess/conduct inventory of GHGs, provide projections of the emissions and identify options to mitigate the emissions
 - Assess the impacts of climate change on the sectors and the national economy, and determine the options to adapt to the impacts
 - Determine the capacity building needs, including education, training and awareness raising;
 - Determine the mitigation and adaptation technology needs
 - Conduct economic analysis;

Assessment Models

1. In-depth national Communications type of assessments including scenario development and biophysical simulations

3. A combination of both and making use of global data and information in similar processes in other countries in the region and/or outside the region

2. Rapid appraisal type assessment such as the NAPA approach

NATIONAL OWNERSHIP

- ▶ Inclusiveness by involvement of relevant stakeholders at all levels
- ▶ Integration or mainstreaming into development frameworks by ensuring that all activities ultimately:
 - **Address multiple risks**
 - **Have multiple benefits; and**
 - **influence and lead to policy development and adjustment,**
 - **Consider the use of domestic funding**

FINAL OUTCOMES

- Identify relevant and prioritized policy options,
- Adjust and/revise the relevant Acts or Regulations
- Develop a strategy and action plan to implement these policy options, paying particular attention to leadership of sectoral work (sectoral WGs) and their synthesis (Ministry of Environment/Coordination Unit)
- Highest level of endorsement
